School lunches

Free School Meals and KS1 Universal Free School Meals children – If your child is a Free School Meal child or is in EYFS or KS1 they are entitled to a free school lunch which would be a hot meal from the school canteen. If you would rather send your child in with their own packed lunch you are welcome to do so. Please book online on SCHOOL FOOD UNITED TO BOOK YOUR CHILD'S PREFERRED LUNCH OPTION. If you are having trouble logging in or creating your School Food United account, please come and Mrs Slater in the School Office. All children should still bring their **own filled water bottle each day** which needs to be taken home at the end of each day and washed and brought back the following day. Please remember that if your personal circumstances change over the Easter break, please come and see us to check if your child is eligible for Free School Meals.

<u>Uniform</u> – Children are expected to continue to wear full school uniform to school each day apart from their PE day on which they will wear their PE kit to school – summer uniform is permitted until the end of October. I totally understand that we have entered into the last term of our academic year, but please be mindful that children's footwear is black shoes or sandals for this term. Also there has been an increase of children wearing jewellery and fancy haircuts.

<u>Jewellery</u>

Please remember that only small stud earrings are allowed in school and no other jewellery, nail varnish or make-up is permitted. Earrings should not be worn on PE days. New piercings should only be done at the beginning of the summer holiday so that they are healed sufficiently to be able to be taken out for PE days.

Haircuts

Please respect our policy. There should be no hair sculptures or tram lines, shaving, highlights or hair colouring of any description. Extreme hairstyles should only be considered at the beginning of the summer holiday. Thank you for your support.



If you would your child to come to breakfast club, please book online on **SCHOOLCOMMS** to book a place for your child/ren. It is important to note that when you are booking a breakfast club place for your child, you pay to secure a place.

The timing is **7:30-8:40** am daily with breakfast options and a selection of activities for your child/ren to take part in. **The cost is £1:50 per child.** To ensure that your child can have breakfast in a timely manner, please ensure that your child DOES NOT arrive after **8:10am**. The reason for this is ensure enough time is given for your child to make a breakfast choice and be able to eat their breakfast before their school day starts.



Afterschool clubs

The choices for afterschool clubs will be coming to you in the first week of the summer term. We will endeavour to support your child's first choice of clubs. Please note! That if your child has chosen a club and has NOT attended for 2 weeks, we will sadly have to cancel your child's club place and offer it to another child.

Attendance

Any absence affects the pattern of a child's schooling and regular absence will seriously affect their learning. Please ensure that you endeavour to get your child to school and in on time for 8:50 am. The playground opens at 8:40am and the official start to the school day is 8:50 am. If your child arrives to school after the registers close, they will receive a late mark that is recorded on your child's attendance record. If your child is ill and is unable to come to school, please contact the school office on 0121 558 1643 and leave a message or speak to Mrs Slater. Please remember that taking holidays in term time will affect your child's schooling and we ask for your co-operation to not take your child away in school time.

Communication

Projects and homework will be set for children over the Easter break on Purple Mash, Times Table Rockstars and Class Dojo. Please ensure that your child/ren have their passwords before leaving school on Friday so that they can access work set for them. A polite reminder that the messaging services will not be available over the Easter break but children can speak with their class teacher on the first day back if they have any issues or questions regarding homework.

Change of circumstances

It's important for us to know that if your personal circumstance have changed you may be entitled to Free School meals. You can help the school to access precious funding for years to come (called Pupil Premium) by registering for free school meals Please apply for free school meals if you are on a low income and / or receive benefits. As well as receiving a free school meal very day (if you choose to take it) you will generate significant funding for our school for many years to come – finding that is all spent on better provision for the children.

Keep in touch

Your parental satisfaction, and the progress, safety and happiness of your child is the top priority for the school. We try hard to do the best we can in all areas but we know that things can and do go wrong. What is important is the way these problems are sorted out. Never, ever hesitate to get in touch for help with any matter, however small it may seem. You can speak to staff on the door in the morning or you can call the office. Teachers will always call you back, and I can usually speak to you straight away. If for any reason we cannot get to you immediately we will always ring you back as soon as we possibly can. Never hesitate to make contact; most things can be resolved and the sooner we know about your concerns, the sooner we can address them.
